On Thursday, November 16th, we received the canned goods and stuffing, packed the potatoes and onions, and assembled the bags. We had a great time of fellowship with some delicious food provided by the Korean United Church. After counting all of the cans, bags of rice, boxes of stuffing, and all of the bags of onions and potatoes, we left for home, weary but looking forward to Packing Night.

The praise service started as Rev. Daniel Kwon, from the

Korean United Church welcomed everyone and prayed. Durwin Parks, SHM President, welcomed everyone on behalf of Skilton House Ministries. Pastor Cedrick Blakney, Co-Director of Operation Brotherhood along with his wife, gave the devotional, and Sister DeLois Corbitt of El Shaddai Baptist Church sang and led a time of singing.
